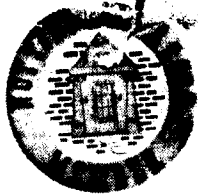

# HINTS FOR THE HOMEOWNER TO HELP OUR NEIGHBORHOOD

**REFUSE CANS**—Take away garbage cans immediately after collections. Replace unsightly cans or better yet, use the N.Y.C. approved TIDY HOME REFUSE SACK now available in your supermarket. These paper bags will hold up to 30 gallons of wet or dry garbage. They are not effected by rain. By using these bags you will

- 1—Cut down on noisy collections
- 2—Avoid carrying cans back to the yard
- 3—Do away with ugly rusted cans

**SIDEWALKS**—Sweep and hose them down and sweep your gutter if necessary.

**WATER**—Don't waste this precious commodity.

**GRASS**—Tell your gardner not to dump cut grass into the gutter. And this goes for you, too.

**DOGS**—We love them. But you must keep them off other people's grass and sidewalks. If your doggie prefers a grassy plot why not use your own lawn and clean up afterwards.

**TREES**—They should be replaced when you lose one. They add as much as \$500 to the value of your property. They trap dirt and dust. They absorb noxious carbon dioxide and replace it with life-sustaining oxygen.
