

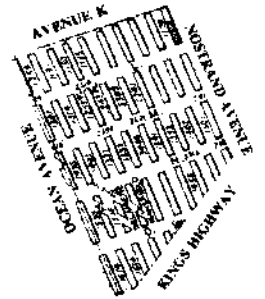

## WE NEED YOUR HELP!

Other people have different reasons for not calling 911. They will say that a vandalized auto is not a major crime, and not worthy of a call. They are often that their insurance rates will go up.

They are wrong! At our last meeting our wonderful "beat cop," P.O. Buckley, begged us to report all incidents to the police. In order to establish crime patterns they must have our input. In order to be there for us, they must know the when, the where, and the kind of crime that was committed. The police circulate, often in unmarked cars, so please cooperate.

### F.Y.I

The New York State Legislature has passed a law that may help us improve our property, and worry less about summonses from the Department of Sanitation. We can post a sign that says it is illegal to place advertisements, etc. our property. We have gotten the exact wording of the sign, and are passing it on to you.

### **YOU HAVE A DEADLINE**

Have you applied for your STAR rebate? This rebate is over and above the \$400 property tax rebate that you receive from the city. It is a state rebate. Property owners who received the basic STAR exemption on their property should have received a form to fill out. It can be done by mail or on line. It must be filled out in order to receive the rebate. Senior citizens who received the enhanced STAR exemption on their property will receive a rebate check automatically. They do not have to fill out an application. If you need assistance call the office of Assemblywoman Helene Weinstein (718-648-4700). It must be received no later than November 30, 2007. That is the deadline!

### **GARBAGE REMINDER**

Rules concerning the placement of garbage curbside.

April 2<sup>nd</sup> through September 30<sup>th</sup> place garbage for collection between 5:00 pm and midnight on the day before collection.

October 1<sup>st</sup> through April 1<sup>st</sup> garbage can be put out between 4:00 pm and midnight on the day before it is to be collected.

**YOU CAN BE FINED IF YOU DO NOT PUT YOUR GARBAGE OUT BETWEEN THE SPECIFIED TIMES.**

### ARE YOU READY?

The Department of Homeland Security has a brochure with an emergency supply list.

- Water, one gallon of water per person per day for at least three days for drinking and sanitation?

- Battery powered or hand-cranked radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert and extra batteries for both?
- Flashlight and extra batteries?
- First aid kit?
- Whistle to signal for help?
- Dust mask, to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place?
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation?
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities?
- Can opener for food (manual, not electric, if kit contains canned food)?
- Local maps?

### The Claim: Eating Ginger Can Cure Motion Sickness

#### THE FACTS

Whether on a ship, in a car or on an airplane, most people have experienced the miseries of motion sickness. While the cause is always the same — conflicting sensory signals going to the brain — the list of potential remedies is vast. One of the oldest, ginger, is among those backed by the most evidence; several studies have found it effective against nausea from seasickness and other conditions.

A study in the journal *Lancet* involved 36 people highly susceptible to motion sickness. The researchers had the subjects take either two capsules of powdered ginger, an antinausea medication or a placebo, and then, 20 minutes later, spin on a motorized chair for up to six minutes. Taking ginger delayed the onset of sickness about twice as long as taking the medication. The study also found that half the subjects who took ginger lasted the full six minutes, compared with none of those given the placebo or the medication.

A study by Danish scientists looked at 80 naval cadets prone to seasickness and found that those given one gram of ginger powder suffered less in a four-hour period than those given a placebo.

Precisely how ginger works is unclear, but at least one study suggested that one of its active compounds, 6-gingerol, enhances "gastrointestinal transport."

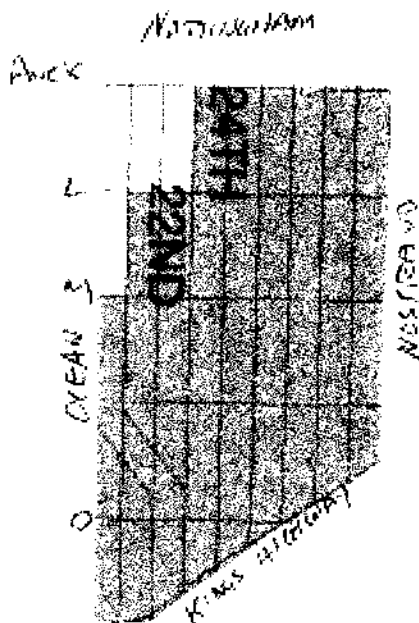

## HURRICANES AND US

We are sure that everyone who is a homeowner received the brochure *Ready New York, Hurricanes and New York City*. However, in reading it carefully we found that the map unclear. We are on the periphery between zone C and no zone at all. Therefore, we googled New York City Hurricane Evacuation Zones and got a map at [http://nyc.gov/html/oem/downloads.pdf/hurricane\\_map\\_english\\_06.pdf](http://nyc.gov/html/oem/downloads.pdf/hurricane_map_english_06.pdf). Then we zoomed in to 600% and found that we in Nottingham are all in zone C. That reads; "Residents in Zone C may experience storm surge flooding from a MAJOR (Category 3 and 4) hurricane making landfall just south of New York City. A major hurricane is unlikely in New York City, but not impossible."

We hope that this will provide some guidance to you when you speak to your insurance provider.

## COME TO OUR NOVEMBER MEETING.

We were certain that we would never see a tornado, but we did. What happened in Bay Ridge could happen here.

Mr. Morici is also involved in the training of response teams, and will let you know about that. The meeting should be interesting. It will be held on Thursday, November 15 at 8:00 pm in the basement of Public School 193. Public School 193 is on the corner of Avenue L and Bedford Avenue.

## CFC DISPOSAL -- A REMINDER

If you dispose of any appliance containing CFCs or freon (refrigerators, air conditioners, water coolers, dehumidifiers, etc.) the gas must be removed before the Department of Sanitation will pick it up. This is a federal mandate. Call 311 for an appointment. They will give you a date to place the appliance curbside for the removal of gas. After it is removed, the appliance will be tagged "CFC FREE." Only tagged items will be collected from your curb.

THE TELEPHONE NUMBER TO REMEMBER IS 311. IT IS ALSO IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER THAT BEFORE DISPOSING, REMOVE ALL DOORS FROM REFRIGERATORS AND FREEZERS. We do not want our children to climb into a refrigerator, accidentally close the door, and smother because he or she is unable to get out.

## WE ARE YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD EYES AND EARS

On Saturday, August 4 our patrol driver, Tony, noticed that a hydrant was open on East 22<sup>nd</sup> Street and between Avenue O and Kings Highway. He called it in to Marsha Edell and she called it in to 311.

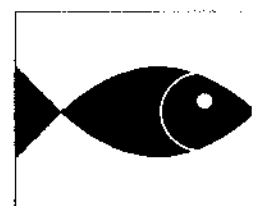
