PERSONALITY PROFILE

From time to time in our Bulletins we want you to meet many of your prominent neighbors, association officers and directors and for this issue we have chosen one of our most modest, most enthusiastic, most civic minded, most dynamic personality, a founder, past president, and director of Nottingham Association.

He was born in Brooklyn on September 23rd, 1887. Graduate of Boys High School Brooklyn, Bachelor of Arts Degree Amherst College (Magna Cum Laude). A year at Purdue and then to Harvard for his LL.B.

Harold James Baily, 3437 Bedford Avenue, who on January 6, 1923 was fortunate to win the hand and heart of Miss Margerite Halsted. His 47 years of active practice of law is now conducted from his offices at 165 Broadway. Licensed to practice before the Supreme Court since 1918 he was engaged as a special attorney for War work with the Department of Justice during World War I and Government Appeal Agent during World War II. His work with J. Edgar Hoover has cemented a long and cherished friendship. He is counsel for Louis Comfort Tiffany Foundation, President of Walt Whitman Foundation and his current law case is the Estate of His Majesty King Faisal, II. He is President of the Phi Beta Kappa Associates of which he was a founder in 1940 and a Director since 1955. Membership in this wonderful organization is limited to 200 members of Phi Beta Kappa who have not defaulted on their election to Phi Beta Kappa, but have accepted their responsibility of public-minded American citizens and agree to contribute \$100 annually for 10 years, at which time Life membership is awarded. \$360,000 has been awarded by the Associates to the Phi Beta Kappa Foundation to enable it to discharge its responsibilities of encouraging and promoting sound and humane education on a nationwide scale. Our distinguished Harold J. Baily has been slightly honored by this group of honor students by being recently re-elected as President of the Associates. The membership directory is filled with prominent names but suffice to name Bernard Baruch, John D., Jr. and Nelson A. Rockefeller. Harold represents our association in Brooklyn Civic Council where he is a member of the Executive Committee. Because of his love for education and devotion to assist others in obtaining an education, he has given unsparingly of his time and effort to the New York Library System and has been a Trustee of The Brooklyn Public Library since 1930; a member of its secretary Board since 1942; member of the New York Governors Commission on State Aid for Libraries; Trustee of the New York Library Trustees Foundation since 1950; Counsel since 1951; Chairman of the Board since 1955; awarded the American Library Association Citation in

1952; and Past Vice President, past Director of American Library Association. Last summer when attending the American Library Trustee Meeting in San Francisco he was presented with a Key to the City by the Mayor. He is also a Member of the Council since 1954; President, trustees section of New York Library Association.

Perhaps you think you are busy, but read on to hear what can be done if one tries.

Harold Baily is a member of the Board of Managers of the Central Board of Brooklyn YMCA since 1931; Member of the New York State and Brooklyn Bar Associations; the Bar Association of the City of New York, the New York County Lawyers Association; Trustee, General Secretary of Beta Theta Pi from 1926-'35; National International Conference Chairman in 1936; Member of Tau Kappa Alpha; Past President Purdue Club; Past President Amherst Club; Member of Harvard Club, New York City; Member of Rembrandt Club, Brooklyn. He is the author of "Glimpses of Lincoln"; Editor of Baird's Manual on American College Fraternities; Reviser of Article on College fraternities for Encyclopedia Britannica.

In 1952 he was awarded the medal for distinguished service to youth by the National Inter-fraternal Conference.

He has been working actively for us and Nottingham since 1921. Let us show him our appreciation and join in wishing to him and Mrs. Baily, continued good health and happiness and say we are all richer for having had the opportunity and privilege to call him friend and neighbor; our Past President and current Director, Harold J. Baily, Esq.
